



Fighting Blindness Canada (Fighting Blindness Canada) has been leading the fight against blindness since 1974. Beginning as the Retinitis Pigmentosa Foundation of Canada, it was created in response to parents watching their children battle incurable eye disease and not being able to do anything about it. Witnessing the considerable challenges in life and feeling powerless, they just had to do something to find treatments to save their loved one's sight. They created a more hopeful future by believing in the power of ground-breaking research.

In 2000, Fighting Blindness Canada grew into the Foundation Fighting Blindness and expanded its mission beyond rare inherited retinal diseases, such as retinitis pigmentosa, Usher syndrome and Stargardt disease to include age-related macular degeneration (AMD). The long-term focus on funding vision research steadily demonstrated that a discovery about one disease often reveals important insights about another. Many of the most promising and exciting vision research projects are relevant to many different eye diseases. These meaningful interconnections inspired and informed the expansion of the mission to include all blinding eye diseases. To communicate this expansion, Fighting

Blindness Canada (Fighting Blindness Canada) evolved in 2019—the country's

leader charitable funder of vision research.

By funding strategic research initiatives, Fighting Blindness Canada offers hope to Canadians by identifying the best, most promising research that is driving treatments and cures for blinding eye diseases, and by raising funds from Canadians to support this essential, sightsaving research.



Over its 47-year history, Fighting Blindness Canada has invested over \$40 million to support vision research and education across Canada: over 200 research grants that have led to more than 600 new discoveries in areas such as stem cell research, neuroprotective therapies, technological developments, pharmaceuticals, and gene therapies.

All of the research and educational initiatives undertaken by Fighting Blindness Canada, support the goals of understanding why vision loss occurs, how it can be slowed or stopped, and how sight can be restored. Highly specialized research has yielded dramatic results to develop new treatments using gene therapy and stem cells, to halt the advancement of inherited eye diseases and treatments for age-related macular degeneration (AMD), glaucoma and diabetes-related vision loss. Results are happening every day to combat variety of blinding eye disease – changing lives forever!





















Now look to the future – currently, a staggering 1.2 MILLION Canadians are blind or partially sighted; an estimated 5.6 MILLION Canadians have a blinding eye disease that puts them at risk of blindness. As the population ages, the number of Canadians with vision loss is expected to grow by 50% over the next 15 years. There is a tidal wave happening and Fighting Blindness Canada is positioned to do something about it.
